- Heritage Action Plan for the town launched by Minister Malcolm Noon TD on 6<sup>th</sup> August, copies available by email request.
- Funding application lodged for LEADER Grant Aid for a Heritage Audit for the town and its hinterland. Tender issued and Heritage Consultants selected.
- Funding sourced in collaboration with Tipperary County Council under the Town and Village Renewal for town signage and local ambassador.

Tipperary Town Pioneers Heritage-led Regeneration: County Town's Unique Heritage is celebrated in first-ever Heritage Action Plan 2020-2022. Tipperary Town HAP is also the first **HAP** for a Town in Ireland

6<sup>th</sup> August 2020: The first-ever Heritage Action Plan for Tipperary Town, which sets out a clear path for heritage-led regeneration based on the town's rich heritage assets has been launched by Minister Malcolm Noonan TD, Minster for Heritage and Electoral Reform.

Tipperary Heritage Action Plan 2020-2022 highlights the significant variety of built, cultural and natural heritage assets that exist within the historic town, along with the need for strategic investment to ensure the town's long-term sustainability and viability. The Plan also stresses the need to reuse and repurpose landmark and traditional buildings in the town centre, as well as enhancing and celebrating the town's wider agricultural, military and commercial legacy. The Plan aims to inform investment decisions for the future management and revitalisation of the historic core and rural hinterland. The timing of the community-led plan is particularly important, given the recent announcement of a July Stimulus Package by the government for the Heritage Sector in Ireland.



Speakers on the day were Cllr. Annemarie Ryan (Shiner) on behalf of the Task Force Heritage Sub-Group, Cathaoirleach Councillor Michael Smith, Carmel Fox, Chairperson, Minister Malcolm Noonan TD and Virginia Teehan, CEO, the Heritage Council.



Other exciting projects being progressed include a signage campaign to Shop in Tipp, SMART benches, signage, local ambassadors for the town, a review of skills needed for business employers and employees and for those upskilling at any stage of life.

Work is ongoing with local entrepreneurs who between them will bring additional jobs to the town in the Food Manufacturing, Planning and Environmental Consultancy and IT sectors.

National Heritage Week, one of Ireland's largest cultural events, runs from 15<sup>th</sup> – 23<sup>rd</sup> August. It is being marked locally by a series of heritage projects developed by our members – www.heritageweek.ie
