Child and Adolescent Mental Health Service (CAMHS) is a medical service for those with severe and enduring mental illness. CAMHS also advises regarding ADHD (Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder). It is a Consultant led community based service provided by a multidisciplinary team. Conditions treated in CAMHS include:

- Moderate to Severe Depressive Disorders
- Severe Anxiety Disorders
- Mood disorders
- Eating disorders
- Psychosis and schizophrenia
- Suicide ideation, where there is likely psychiatric cause
- ADHD

CAMHS is unable to be of assistance to those suspected to have a diagnosis of Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) unless the primary service provider (Disability services) is already involved.

Eligibility: Young people who are suspected of having a psychiatric disorder that is affecting their ability to function in day-to-day activities up to the age of 17 years in the South of the county.

Referral: As with all medical services, referrals are only accepted from another medical practitioner, i.e., GP or medical doctor after the child or young person has been seen and assessed by same.

Sexual health prevention and treatment services include a broad range of health care at different levels, both public and private, throughout the health care system. The main elements include prevention of sexually transmitted infections (STIs) and clinical care for those with STIs, contraception, screening for diseases such as genital chlamydia, psychosexual counseling and support, and specialised services for high-risk groups and diseases.

HSE public STI screening services are almost exclusively based in hospitals and special community clinic settings around Ireland and are free. STI screening is free of charge and confidential.

The HSE Gold Star Disability Project aims to work together with people with disabilities, volunteers and all community members to raise disability awareness and to improve integration of people with disabilities in local communities. The project aims to assist communities in ensuring that premises, services and activities offered are accessible and welcoming to all.

The Gold Star project is community based and is set up to work towards universal access for all. There is no statutory budget commitment for the project and all project work and achievements to date have been realised through engagement with people with disabilities, volunteers and collaboration with the private, public and community and voluntary sectors.

The HSE Gold Star project is part of the Disability Services Team in CHO Area 5 and is headed up by a Development Worker who engages with the community to identify and deliver the projects. Referrals are made to the project from the Disability Team, including the PHNS (Public Health Nurses), Physios, Occupational Therapists and the Speech and Language Therapist teams.

Everyone in the community is invited to engage with the project and to come together to identify access issues and barriers to full participation and to work together with an interagency approach to address the barriers and to find the most practical and cost effective solutions to the issues.

The project works closely with Tipperary CoCo and co-deliver a number of issues based initiatives (e.g. Sign of the Times ISL website development, Back in 5 parking campaign with CoCo and IWA, development of the Let's Able Not Label Gold Star Disability Awareness Training Programme GSDAT)

The following are some of the projects underway:

1. The Tipperary Gold Star coordinator is supporting the national roll out of the Gold Star model. To date the project has rolled out in Dun Laoighaire/Rathdown Dublin, Bray, Co. Wicklow, Wexford Town Centre, Kilkenny City, and is currently underway in Galway.

2. Gold Star is represented on myriad of national and local disability groups and networks.
3. Working on a train the trainers project to upskill and enable a group of people with disabilities to deliver a suite of GSDAT programmes in community settings.
4. Development of the Irish Sign Language training website (Sign of the Times project). Working on developing a model for best practice for engaging with members of the Deaf community.
5. Music and Art Therapy programme roll out – engaging young and older people with autism in music therapy, engaging people with disabilities in themed art projects.
6. A group of people with disabilities are currently trained with the Gold Star project to head up a suite of access audits of 10 Broadband Connection Points in partnership with Tipperary CoCo across the County of Tipperary.

How to engage with the project: Referrals are made through the Disability Services team, disability agencies and self-referrals.

An Garda Síochána has a proud tradition in serving communities and protecting the State with over 16,000 Garda members, Civilians and Reserve members who are committed to delivering a functioning police and security service.

Reporting a Crime:

If you are in Ireland and are a victim of a crime or witness a crime, you should contact the Garda Síochána (Irish police force). The emergency services telephone number is 999 or 112.

If you are deaf, hard of hearing or speech-impaired, you can report a crime by SMS text message on 112. You can find more about the emergency text service.

If it would make you more comfortable, you can request to speak to a male or female Garda.

If you do not speak English fluently, the Gardaí can provide free translation services to you.

In less urgent situations, you should contact your local Garda station to report a crime.

If you are unable to go to a Garda Station, you can ask that a Garda comes to your home to take a report.

You can report incidents of dangerous driving and other traffic-related incidents to the Garda Traffic Watch hotline on **0818 205 805**.

Phoning the Gardaí and reporting a crime online

It helps the Gardaí if you give as much information as possible but you do not have to give your name when reporting a crime. If you wish to provide confidential information relating to crime or other activities, you can:

Contact the Garda Confidential Line on **1800 666 111**.

Contact Crimestoppers on **1800 250 025**. Staffed by members of the Garda National Bureau of Criminal Investigation, Crimestoppers guarantees anonymity and offers cash rewards for information.

How to report child sex abuse to the Gardaí:

The Gardaí operate a dedicated phone line for reporting child sexual abuse: **1800 555 22**.

How to report a missing person:

You can also find information on reporting a missing person. **1800 442 552**

How to report drug dealing:

You can safely and confidentially pass on information about drug dealing by calling the [Crimestoppers](#) freephone confidential number **1800 250 025** or the [Garda Confidential](#) freephone number **1800 666 111**.

You will speak to a trained operator who will ask you for the information you have on drug dealing and nothing else. You will not be asked for your name. Your phone number may be visible but it will not be traced or recorded.

The information gathered is passed on directly to the [Garda National Drugs and Organised Crime Bureau \(GNDOCB\)](#) which assesses its usefulness. The GNDOCB passes relevant information on to the Gardaí in the specified area for investigation.

The Gardaí can use the information to build a case against a known drug dealer, to investigate new allegations of drug dealing activity in a community or to make an arrest.

Reporting a crime online:

You can [report certain thefts online](#) using a [declaration of theft of property form](#). The online form should only be used where the property stolen is worth less than €1,000.

Túsla Child & Family services provide a Child Protection service under the Children First Act 2015. Where there are concerns relating to abuse and severe neglect of children, the service assesses these and takes appropriate measures in accordance with Children First: National Guidance to ensure child safety and welfare. This may mean provision of alternative care, either in foster care or residential care.

In both the North & South of the Tipperary County, the Child & Family services are organised into teams, as follows:

- Duty & Intake team – screening referrals and determining the first response.

- Protection & Welfare teams - managing medium to long-term cases of families in the community setting.

- Children In Care teams - responsible for children and young people who come into alternative care and their families.

- Fostering team – responsible for liaising with foster families with children in their care.

- There is also an After-Care service to assist young people to prepare for leaving alternative care on reaching adulthood and to support them subsequently to live independently.

Target Group: Children and young people at risk of Physical Abuse, Sexual Abuse, Emotional Abuse and Neglect.

Referral: Referral through Túsla Social Work Department; referral through An Garda Síochána; referral through the Túsla portal.

The Prevention Partnership Family Support (PPFS) Programme:

The Prevention Partnership Family Support (PPFS) Programme is a Túsla-led programme which aims to engage with and support families around family support issues at Prevention or Early Intervention levels, in partnership with relevant community-based services.

Túsla is committed to providing high quality services to children and families at the earliest opportunity across all levels of need. Providing help to children and families early in the stage of a difficulty can prevent situations getting worse. Working in partnership is a very important aspect of this work. Túsla aims to work closely with families, other agencies and professionals so that we can respond quickly to the needs of children. Early identification and provision of help at community level is in children's best interests.

Family Support Family Support is delivered through community-based programmes and services. The main focus of these Family Support services is on Early Intervention, aiming to promote and protect the health, well-being and rights of all children, young people and their families. Particular attention is given to those who are vulnerable or at risk. Specialist services provide support for those families affected by domestic violence or child abuse. Family Support services are generally provided to families in their own homes and communities.

Meitheal:

Túsla has developed the Meitheal approach to help children and families where they may need the support of more than one service. Meitheal is an old Irish term that describes how people come together to assist with crops or tasks. In this context, Meitheal is a Túsla National Practice Model to ensure that the needs and strengths of children and families are effectively identified, understood and responded to in a timely way. The aim of Meitheal is to ensure that children and families receive support and help in an integrated and coordinated way that is easily accessible to them. Through the Meitheal model, practitioners in different agencies communicate and work together to bring together a range of expertise, knowledge and skills to meet the needs of the child and family within their community. The family's consent to participate is a key condition for a Meitheal intervention to proceed.

Child and Family Support Networks:

(CFSNs) Local CFSNs consist of all services that play a role in the lives of children and families in a given geographical area. This includes local statutory children and families service providers (e.g. psychology, public health nurses, social work, justice, education and welfare) and local voluntary and community children and families services.

The Child and Family Support Network Coordinator supports the development of the Child and Family Support Networks and oversees the Meitheal process.

Other strands of Prevention Partnership & Family Support

- Participation: Supporting the participation of children and young people in decisions that affect them.
- Parenting: Supporting parents in developing their parenting skills. Such supports include parenting programmes, the Tusla Parenting 24/7 website and the work of the Parenting Support Champions in promoting key parenting messages at local level.

Target Group: Parents, children and young people, aged 0 – 17 years.

- Referral by families by direct contact with the Child & Family Support Network Coordinator.
- Referrals by professionals only with parents' consent. A Meitheal Request form must be completed with the parents.

Tipperary Town and District SCP -School Completion Programme:

The School Completion Programme (SCP) is a targeted programme of support for primary and post primary children and young people who have been identified as potentially at risk of early school leaving or who are out of school and have not successfully transferred to an alternative learning site (i.e. Youthreach, Community Training Centre etc.) or employment. It is a support under the Delivering Equality of Opportunity in Schools (DEIS) Programme, funded by Tusla Education Support Services (Tess). SCP aims to retain a young person to completion of the leaving certificate, equivalent qualification or suitable level of educational attainment which enables them to transition into further education, training or employment.

The SCP is one of three strands of Tusla Education Support Service (Tess) including the Home School Community Liaison (HSCL) Scheme and the Educational Welfare Service. All three strands share the same national outcomes:

- Improved Attendance
- Improved Participation
- Improved Retention

Tusla Education Support Service (TESS):

Educational Welfare Services which are part of the Tusla Education Support Service (TESS) deal with children and families who have difficulties in relation to school attendance, participation, retention. The TESS statutory and school support services of the Child and Family Agency work collaboratively with schools and other relevant services to secure better educational outcomes for children and young people.

Understanding Energy Guzzlers and How to Control Them

Certain appliances in the home are “energy guzzlers,” consuming a large amount of energy. Identifying these and using them more efficiently can cut costs and lower your energy use.

Electric Shower: Electric showers consume around 10kWh of energy per hour. At €0.25 per kWh, a 15-minute shower costs about €0.62. Shorter showers can save a lot of energy and money over time.

Tumble Dryer: An average dryer cycle costs around €1.03. Air drying instead of using the dryer, could make significant savings over a year.

Dishwasher: Running your dishwasher in Eco mode and only with a full load can save up to 30% in energy costs.

Fridge/Freezer: Keeping your fridge at 4°C and freezer at -18°C, along with sealing gaps, can reduce energy use.

Washing Machine: Lowering the wash temperature from 40°C to 30°C can save around 30-40% per wash in energy used.

Quick Tip: *Appliances that heat or cool are often the biggest energy users. By using lower settings and running full loads, you can reduce their impact significantly.*



Low-Energy Cooking: Make Meals and Save on Energy Costs

Preparing meals can use a lot of energy. A standard oven and hob use around 2.5 kWh for one hour, costing approximately €0.63 per hour at €0.25 per kWh.

Here are some smart alternatives:

Microwave: Cooks in less time and uses about half the energy of an oven. Ideal for reheating, steaming, and cooking small portions

Air Fryer: Consumes about half the energy of a traditional oven and cooks food much faster.

Slow Cooker: Uses very little energy—great for soups, stews, and meals cooked in bulk. Cooking a meal takes time, but can save up to 60% of energy compared to oven cooking.

Batch Cooking: Make several meals at once to save both time and energy. Reheat portions as needed in the microwave or air fryer for quick, low-cost meals throughout the week.

Beware of Energy Vampires!

Some appliances use energy even when they're switched "off" but still plugged in. These "energy vampires" can add up to 10% of your total energy use.

Common energy vampires include:

Televisions, game consoles, and computers: Unplug when not in use or use a smart power strip to turn everything off at once.

Microwaves, coffee makers, and phone chargers: These appliances consume energy even in standby mode, so switch them off at the plug.

Wifi routers and digital boxes: Consider switching these off overnight to save energy.

Tip: *Using a power strip makes it easier to turn off multiple devices at once. Just remember: if you don't need it, unplug it!*



No or Low-Cost Tips to Save Energy Today

Simple changes can cut costs without much effort. Here are tips for various household tasks:

Washing and Drying Clothes
